- Fast development in China-Africa relations;
- China has provided an alternative for Africans;
- The infrastructure China did in Africa is a promotion for international investment
- African view of China: generally positive

- Youth education & capacity building is vital in African social development and industrialization


African Students in China: Four Phases

- First phase 1956 to 1966
- Second phase: 1967-1977
- Third phase: 1978-1995
- Fourth phase: 1995-present


Phase I, 1956-1966

- China-Egypt agreement of cultural exchange
- Egyptian archeologist Ahmed Fakhry came to China and taught at Peking University
- 4 Egyptian students came to China supervised by famous artist Prof. Li Keran;
- 1950s, 24 African students with Chinese-scholarship
- 1960, 95 African students in China;
- 1966, 164 students from fourteen African countries.

Emmanuel John Hevi's Book (1963)



Features

- Political support each other, cultural exchange, promotion of mutual understanding;
- Lack of experience in educational cooperation
- Hevi's book criticized China's policy
- Reasonable in several aspects (life standard, isolation, racial discrimination, etc.)
- Emphasis on ideology and political stand

Phase II, 1966-1976 TAZARA

- With the Cultural Revolution, university cloese;
- Tanzania-Zambia Railway is a modern legend;
- When the West declined the project, China took it up and finished in time (1970-1976).
- Training modes included the following three;
- 1.To run technical students training in China;
- 2. To open training class in Tanzania and Zambia;
- 3. On-job training in two countries.

Technician Students in China

- In June 1972, 200 students from Tanzania and Zambia came to China, 179 of them finally graduated in September 1975 (North University of Transportation, 北方交通大学)
- They were trained in transportation, Locomotive specialty, vehicle major, communication major, signal specialty, railway engineering specialty and financial professional.
- 1976-1977, there were more than 400 African students in China, 1/3 of foreign students then.

Features

- After their return, they played a very important role in their own countries.
- Trained the backbones of transportation technicians in Tanzania and Zambia;
- Mutual support in international arena (UN issue)
- African students in China: occasional incidents caused by cultural misunderstanding, racial discrimination, etc.

Phase III 1978-1995

- After Cultural Revolution, China first enrolled 1236 new international students with 95% enjoying Chinese Government scholarship (CGS). Among them, 121 were African students.
- 30 Africans with CGS in 1979, 43 in 1980 and 80 in 1981, 230 in 1983, 256 in 1995;
- Self-financed African students increased rapidly, 6 in 1990, 721 in 1995.


Features

- More African students, more exchange of cultures.
- Ethiopian President Mulatu Teshome, 1977-1991; Several clashes between African & Chinese students around the 1980s (1983), racial tensions (1988).
- Reasons: value difference, economic conditions, social change, international affairs,
- Criticism of "national racism"

Phase IV 1996-Present

- 1996, President Jiang visited Africa, put forward 5 proposals for all-around China-Africa cooperation.
- Great increase of CGS to African students,
- 256(1995), 922(1996), 1154(2000), 1244(2003), 1861(2006),4824(2009), 6717(2012), 8470(2015)
- Great increase of self-financed African students
- 118(1996), 1876(2006), 41322(2015)
- In 2015, African students reached 49,792 including 8,470 CGS and 41,322 self-financed students.

Features

- Rapid development of China's economy;
- Forum on China-Africa Cooperation in 2000;
- Olympic Games held in Beijing in 2008 opened African young people's eyes;
- China's efforts to promote their international education;
- African governments financed their students to China

Trend: Three Characters

- 1. Rapid increase, with international students; In 2009, 238,184 foreign students; 2015, 390,000.
- 2. More self-financed students, in 2015, self-financed African students are five times of CGS holders;
- 3. Pursuing degrees, Most of Afr. students in China are pursuing their degrees and the degree-students increased rapidly. 2014, 84% Afr. students in China set up the degree as their goal, only 16% chose non-degree courses.

China-Africa Accra Conference July 4-5, 2017

- China-Africa Joint Research Conference "Building Resilient Industries and Infrastructure for Economic Transformation in Africa: The Role of China (Accra, July 4-5, 2017)
- The report of the conference pointed out:
- African training institutes are very important to make highly skilled & competitive youth on international front.
- In this aspect, Africa need China's support.

First African Students' Competition of Innovation and Entrepreneurship Nov.11, 2017 in Shenzhen

- Organized by Peking University, Zhejiang Normal University and Center for China-African Sustainable Development and financed by Amanbo, a private company;
- 218 African students of 22 countries from 29 universities in China joined the competition;
- six finals (Zambian students won the 1st Award, Cameroun and Mauritius students won the 2nd)

African Students' Job Fair Nov.15, 2017 in Beijing

- First African Students' Job Fair in Beijing with Chinese officials, African diplomats and students;
- 60 governmental, local and private companies offered about 500 jobs in Africa;
- 400 African students attended the job fair, while about 1000 African youth handed in applications before the fair
